The following information and resources are brought to your attention for the health and safety of you, your family, and our beautiful community. Our community's first focus is safety; our second is to keep our property values as high as possible! Address any HOA questions or concerns to one of our community board members/volunteers listed above.

- 1. All **screening walls** surrounding Rockcreek Place HOA along Hedgcoxe to Ohio and Ohio south of Ridgedale are scheduled to be replaced beginning in the Fall 2021. A door hanger will be placed on your front door prior to work beginning.
- 2. Sidewalks along our HOA's perimeter requiring repair have been reported to The City of Plano using the Fix It application on the *plano.gov* website. If you have a **damaged curb or sidewalk** outside your home or see one in an HOA common area like a parkway, please call 469-773-4948 or open a **Fix It Plano** report.
- 3. Per the HOA Covenants, **garbage carts** must be removed from street visibility within 24 hours of City pick-up. Carts cannot be stored in front of or at the side of the house unless behind a full enclosure.
- 4. **Fire ant hills** on members' property (including front parkways) are the responsibility of the homeowner to treat/kill. The HOA only treats for fire ant hills in HOA common areas.
- 5. **Mud** should be immediately removed from the sidewalk in front of your home to prevent walkers from having to walk in the street or from slipping, which would be a liability for the homeowner. Representatives from City of Plano Property Standards will cite violators. Consult *plano.gov/219/property-standards* for more details.
- 6. City of Plano **Property Standards** at <u>972-208-8150</u> is part of the Neighborhood Services Department. They are a wealth of information on home occupation restrictions, illegal and prohibited zoning uses, property maintenance, open storage, trash and debris, etc.
- 7. **Shrubs and trees** should be kept cut inside the homeowners' fence line or property line in front and along the walking paths to prevent walker injury.

- 8. **Shrubs and trees** touching the screening walls along Hedgcoxe and/or Ohio should be cutback to prevent damage to City property.
- 9. **Newspapers** and other debris left in your front yard could indicate your house is vacant. Remove all material from front yards to discourage break-ins and keep our community safe. Call 214-977-8333 to stop receiving the **Dallas Morning News** Briefings and/or 972-424-9504 for the **Plano Star Courier**.
- 10. Keep your backyards mowed, landscape trimmed, and containers with standing water emptied to **prevent rodents**, **mosquitos**, **fleas**, **chiggers**, **and termites**\_from infesting your home and ours. Good maintenance also discourages coyotes and bobcats from seeking food, water, and shelter on your property!
- 11. The City of Plano Fire Code *library.municode.com*, Texas/Plano/Chapter 8, states single-family homes shall have **address numbers** that are a minimum of 3 inches in height; in a color contrasting with the background'; and clearly visible and legible from the street fronting the property and **rear alleyway where alleys exist.**
- 12. **Sewer and trash rates** went up November 1, 2020. Go to <u>ecop.plano.gov</u> for details.
- 13. Keep abreast of watering guidelines at <u>plano.gov/water</u>. Address ending in an odd number water on Tuesdays and even numbers (and the HOA) on Thursdays. Go to <u>watermyyard.org/#/Location</u> for details
